

The Dutch Emission Authority (NEa)

- Independent national authority which implements and enforces <u>market tools</u> that contribute to a climate-neutral society.
- Min Economic Affairs and Climate Policy: Min Infrastructure and Watermanagement; Min Finance
- Tasks oa
 - Emissions Trading (EU ETS), Renewable Energy (HE), CO2 levy industry.
- 120 Employee, Headquarter The Hague

EU emissions trading system (EU ETS)

Cap & Trade system





- Participants must obtain allowances to emit CO₂
- The total amount of available allowances diminishes every year
- Expected prices for CO₂-rights will rise and will thus be an incentive to become more sustainable

Rights can be obtained:

- auction
- other companies (trade)
- for free (not for shipping)





The EU ETS is the tool in Europe to reach the climate targets in the **Paris Climate Agreement**, and further refined in the **Green Deal**:

'A reduction of at least 55% in CO2 emissions from 1990 to 2030, with Europe as the first climate neutral continent by 2050.'

Fit for 55 making EU ETS more ambitious, new provisions:

- extension to emissions from maritime transport
- faster reduction of emissions allowances in the system
- gradual phasing-out of free allowances for some sectors
- implementation of CORSIA
- a new self-standing emissions trading system for buildings, road transport and fuels for additional sectors
